

THE TEENS PROGRAM

The Teens formal programming at Enlightening is divided into two categories – **Workshops** and **Electives** – and allows for a more in-depth study of the arts as well as a bit of independence in determining your curriculum and schedule. Teens select one of the five visual and performing arts **Workshops** – Advanced Fan Fiction, Castle Design 101, Comedy and Improv, Make Your Own Film, and Potter Podcasting for Dummies – and attend all four sessions of the workshop (check the timetable for your specific workshop times) over the two-day program to complete a project or performance.

During your non-workshop class times, there are a number of **Electives** from which to choose, some designed just for Teens and some listed under either the Adults or the Kids programming and open to all ages. Those electives not specific to Teens are indicated by * or ** in the timetable, and those class descriptions can be found under their respective programs.

Prefects are assigned based on the selected workshop and will assist Teens with finding classes, staying on schedule, and working on projects or performances. There are morning and afternoon **Breaks** between workshop and elective sessions where Teens and Prefects can relax, socialize, or browse the House Bulletin Boards in the E7 Common Room. There are restrooms on the second floor of Houston Hall, and vending machines and The Creperie are available for snacks.
