

THE TWEENS PROGRAM

The Tweens formal programming for 9- to 12-year-olds strikes a balance between arts and sciences, mental and physical challenges, and teamwork and debate. For wizard and muggle Tweens alike, this is the age of questioning one's identity within a group setting, and the Tweens programming allows plenty of room for exploration.

Tweens are divided into three groups – 3rd Years, 4th Years, and 5th Years – for some classes to allow for a more hands-on learning experience and age-appropriate instruction. Your group assignment is given during the check-in process on Thursday. A Prefect will be assigned to each group and will remain with that group during all formal programming hours (9am–12pm and 2pm–5pm). Parents sign in Tweens with their designated Prefect during morning announcements in the E7 Common Room (8:45am) and sign them out between 11:50am–12pm for lunch break. For the afternoon sessions, the sign-in time is 1:45–2pm, and sign-out is 4:50–5pm, always in the E7 Common Room. **Please be on time for Sign-In/Out so as not to disrupt classes.**
